

PARVOVIRUS AGREEMENT

(EXAMPLE)

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT PARVO AND YOUR NEW PUPPY

- There is a 14 day incubation period for the disease, meaning the puppy could have been exposed to parvo in the last 14 days and may show signs of the disease in the next 14 days.
- Parvo can live in the environment for 6 to 8 months, especially in porous material such as gravel and grass, bleach is the only easily accessible cleaner available to the public that will kill the disease, but it is not as effective on organic matter
- ALL puppies are vaccinated on intake, however, the vaccine takes 10 days to take full effect
- Due to the age of the puppy the maternal antibodies may prevent the vaccine from taking full effect, typically maternal antibodies stop working sometime between 6 weeks and 12 weeks of age, once they are no longer active the vaccine will be able to work as intended
- Puppies need a minimum of 3 distemper/parvo vaccines to completely protect them from the parvo disease, speak with a vet on when those should be scheduled
- Parvo tests ONLY show reliable results if the puppy is already showing signs of the disease
- We CAN NOT guarantee at the time of adoption that your puppy has not been exposed to Parvo in the last 14 days, meaning there is ALWAYS a risk that the puppy could end up diagnosed with Parvo in the next 14 days, if you have any questions in regards to disease prevention and your new puppy you will need to speak with a vet
- ALL adoption fees are final, we are unable to give refunds, we can however offer a voucher towards another adoption if your puppy were to become sick and was returned to us
- We are unable to financially cover the cost of life saving parvo treatment, this will be the responsibility of the adopter. However, we will take the puppy back and offer immediate humane euthanasia at no cost.
